Today I have the pleasure of welcoming a special guest who is actually unique in his knowledge of the religions of this world: Professor Dr. Schirrmacher.

Professor Dr. Schirrmacher, is not only Deputy General Secretary of the World Evangelical Alliance, and thus representative of 600 million Protestant Christians.

He is also Chairman of the Advisory Council of the Central Council of Oriental Christians in Germany, to which he provides advice on all important issues. In this function I got to know him.

But Dr. Schirrmacher is not only a theologian. The subject of 'human rights' plays just as important a role in his life as religion. And especially the freedom of religion as part of the universally valid human rights is a matter close to his heart.

It is probably rare in life to meet a person who in a short life span has got to know, studied and internalized so many aspects of the most different religions. His explanations, studies and analyses on this subject should fill entire rooms and open up a fascinating world to many a young student, which one would not understand without a thorough introduction, for which Schirrmacher has created the basics.

And understanding also means acting. Acting in the sense of a partly critical, but peaceful and especially fair discourse between the ethnic groups and religions. And so one can rightly claim that the teacher, theologian, religious scholar, human rights activist and author that he is, is most valued by religious and political leaders for what distinguishes him most:

Professor Dr. Thomas Schirrmacher is a peace ambassador and mediator at the same time.

He is exactly the kind of person we need in a world that - strengthened by digital media - seems to be surrounded only by conflict.

On 18 October 2018 we met once again in the Deutsche Bundestag, the Federal Parlament. I was very impressed by his commitment to Christians around the world. It was then that I realized how important he is for us Pontos-Greeks, and at my request to give a lecture on the topics that concerns us, he kindly agreed immediately.
